7. Public Comments

Police Jury President, Mike McCormic, allowed a period of public comment on any item on the agenda. Mr. McCormic advised everyone that they would be allowed to comment later during the meeting on particular agenda items, if they desire.

Joy Vallery commented on the condition of Laura Lane. She reported that the road is nearly impassable. She expressed concern for individuals living on the road that might need emergency medical care or fire protection services.

Joseph Hendon addressed the police jury and stressed the need to clean and rehabilitate the road ditches. Mr. Hendon suggested hiring additional employees to work on the parish ditches. He also stressed the need for the parish to enforce ordinances pertaining to road damage caused by large trucks.

Mr. Edward Hebert addressed the turnover of parish employees. He noted that the lack of trained employees operating road equipment contributes to the poor condition of the roads. He stated that the parish is always in a training mode with employees.

Mr. Stewart suggested leasing two bulldozers to properly clean and form the ditches along the parish roads.

9. Planning Commission

No member of the Sabine Parish Planning Commission was in attendance.

10. Mr. Mike Duffy – Enterprise Fleet Management

Mr. Mike Duffy with Enterprise Fleet Management gave a presentation to the Police Jury showing the advantages of leasing the Jury's light duty fleet. The objective of the proposed lease is to free Police Jury funds while providing a safer and more reliable fleet of trucks. Sixty-four per cent (64%) of the Police Jury's light duty fleet is eight (8) years old or older. This results in higher maintenance costs and poorer fuel economy.

The proposed lease is expected to save \$85,000 in the first year and a total of approximately \$400,000 over a four-year period. Secretary Treasurer Weatherford recommended disposing of the oldest light duty vehicles and replacing them with leased vehicles to test the impact of the lease on fuel and maintenance costs.

Mr. Weatherford suggested tabling consideration of the proposed lease until the next meeting of the Police Jury.

11. Mr. Edward Anthony – Region IV Watershed Initiative

Mr. Edward Anthony addressed the Police Jury concerning the Louisiana Watershed Initiative, Region IV. The Louisiana Watershed Initiative was formed to help manage future flood risk through watershed-based solutions. The state of Louisiana is divided into eight watershed regions. Sabine Parish is in Region I and Region IV.

The challenge of the Louisiana Watershed Initiative is to get citizens thinking about flooding as a regional event. The actions of one community can impact entire ecosystems. The Louisiana Watershed Initiative is striving to fundamentally change how Louisiana addresses flood risk reduction.

One billion, two hundred million dollars has been allocated by the Federal government for watershed-based floodplain management in Louisiana. The mission of the Louisiana Watershed Initiative is to reduce flood risk, improve floodplain management, and maximize the natural and beneficial functions of floodplains.

Mr. Anthony encouraged the Police Jury to submit applications for projects in both Region I and Region IV.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 1 OF 2018 WHICH PROVIDES THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ROADS, BRIDGES, CULVERTS, AND DITCHES IN SABINE PARISH, LOUISIANA

17. <u>Consider an Ordinance Reducing the Speed Limit on Weathy Lane to Twenty (20) Miles Per Hour</u>

ORDINANCE 7 of 2021

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SPEED LIMIT FOR WEATHY LANE IN ROAD DISTRICT 15 (WARD 5)

WHEREAS, the Sabine Parish Police Jury is responsible for the safety of individuals traveling on parish roads, and

WHEREAS, the current posted speed limit for Weathy Lane in Road District 15 (Ward 5) allows drivers to travel at speeds of up to forty-five (45) miles per hour without being issued a citation, and

WHEREAS, the Sabine Parish Police Jury has determined that this is a dangerous speed for travel on Weathy Lane in Road District 15 (Ward 5).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that the maximum speed limit for any vehicle travelling on Weathy Lane in Road District 15 (Ward 5) shall be fifteen (15) miles per hour.

Consider Assistance to Wards Heavily Damaged by Rain (Ward 1, Ward 2, and Ward 3) Mr. Sepulvado reported that several road districts in the southern part of the parish have been heavily damaged by the recent rains and are in desperate need of financial aid and assistance with equipment and labor. He noted that the road employees are parish-wide employees who can be rotated from districts that have not been as badly impacted. He also reminded the Jury that there is a cooperative endeavor agreement between the road districts that allows equipment owned by less impacted districts to be used in the hard-hit areas.

Mr. Sepulvado stated that he felt it was the responsibility of the entire parish to assist Ward1 (Road District 18), Ward 2 (Road District 16), and Ward 3 (Road District 9) to recover from this disaster.
