12. Mr. Scott Gowan- Report on the Office of Emergency Preparedness Activities During the Period October Through December 2023

Mr. Scott Gowan, Director of the Sabine Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, reported on the activities and accomplishments of the Office of Emergency Preparedness during the last quarter of 2023.

The Sabine Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness has accepted two grants, one is a federal grant and the other is a state grant through the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness.

New lighting was installed in the warehouse and the following items were acquired:

- Water heater
- Air conditioner
- 35 foot long loading ramp to unload trailers
- 24 foot long low-boy trailer

The Sabine Parish of Office of Emergency Preparedness is in the process of acquiring Starlink internet service.

13. Mr. Stanley Cook, Deputy Coroner, - Report on the Coroner's Office Activities During the Period of January Through December 2023

Dr. Mark Holder, Coroner, and Mr. Stanley Cook, Deputy Coroner, reported on the activities and accomplishments of the Sabine Parish Coroner's Office during 2023.

Mr. Cook reported that the Coroner's Office received 578 calls of service during the year. The Office worked 271 deaths, committed 195 individuals, and worked 102 cremation investigations.

He noted that all investigators for the Coroner's Office are now certified homicide investigators.

14. Planning Commission

No representative for the Sabine Parish Planning Commission was present at the meeting.

30. Consider Adopting a Twenty (20) Miles Per Hour Speed Limit on Hardy Road Located in Ward 1, Road District 18

The Sabine Parish Police Jury desires to adopt a twenty (20) miles per hour speed limit on Hardy Road. The first step in this process is introducing an ordinance for this purpose. Secretary Treasurer Weatherford then read the proposed ordinance aloud.

ORDINANCE 1 of 2024

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A TWENTY (20) MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT ON HARDY ROAD IN ROAD DISTRICT 18 (WARD 1)

WHEREAS, the Sabine Parish Police Jury is responsible for the safety of individuals traveling on parish roads, and

WHEREAS, the current posted speed limit for Hardy Road, located in Road District 18 (Ward 1), allows drivers to travel at speeds of up to forty-five (45) miles per hour without being issued a citation, and

WHEREAS, the Sabine Parish Police Jury has determined that this is a dangerous speed for travel on Hardy Road in Road District 18 (Ward 1)

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that the maximum speed limit for any vehicle travelling on Hardy Road in Road District 18 (Ward 1) shall be twenty (20) miles per hour.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall be in effect March 31, 2024, and it shall be published one time in the Official Journal of the Parish of Sabine, State of Louisiana, along with any other minutes of the meeting.
