12. Stan Hazlip- 2024 Renewal of PGRMA Health and Dental Insurance

Mr. Stan Hazlip with the Hazlip Companies presented a renewal proposal for group health care coverage from the Parish Government Risk Management Agency (PGRMA). There will be an approximately 2.5% increase in expense projected for 2024.

The Hazlip Companies presented a plan with a \$750 deductible / \$3,500 out-of-pocket maximum. This is the same as the Jury’s current PPO benefit plan with no significant changes. The annual premium is estimated to be \$1,136,173.63, an increase of \$27,711.55 compared to the 2023 premium. There will also be an increase in the estimated dental premium of \$2,134.40 to \$40,161.08, an increase of approximately 5.6%.

No action was taken on this item and the Hazlip Companies were asked to shop the insurance plan for the Parish with other interested carriers.

13. Buddy Maxwell- Present Renewal Proposals for General Liability, Automobile Liability and Physical Damage, Management Liability, Employee Bond, Property, Cyber Liability, and Workmen’s Compensation Insurance for 2024

Mr. Buddy Maxwell with Risk Services of Louisiana, Inc. presented proposals for various types of coverage. The premium for the package of coverage proposed by Mr. Maxwell increased \$49,613 (19.1%) compared to the prior year for the following reasons:

- The values of insured buildings increased by \$4,319,528 based on Traveler’s replacement cost estimator.
- The number of insured vehicles increased by eleven (11) units.
- The value of insured equipment increased by \$2,699,879.

The total premium for the proposed package of coverage is \$308,166.

Mr. Maxwell also provided a proposal for Workers’ Compensation Insurance with an estimated premium of \$197,394.14.

ORDINANCE No. 15 of 2023

AN ORDINANCE TEMPORARILY MOVING THE POLLING PLACE FOR PRECINCT 1-5 FROM 1738 SAN ANTONIO AVENUE, MANY, LOUISIANA TO 1756 SAN ANTONIO AVENUE, MANY, LOUISIANA

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 13 of 2023 temporarily moved the polling place for Precinct 1-5 from 1710 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana to 1738 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana (for the October 14, 2023 and November 18, 2023 elections only), and

WHEREAS, 1738 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana, has become unavailable as a polling place for Precinct 1-5 for the election to be held November 18, 2023,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that the polling place for Precinct 1-5 be temporarily moved (for the November 18, 2023, election only) from 1738 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana, to 1756 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana. Subsequent to the November 18, 2023 election, the polling place for Precinct 1-5 will revert back to 1710 San Antonio Avenue, Many, Louisiana.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall be in effect October 18, 2023, and it shall be published one time in the Official Journal of the Parish of Sabine, State of Louisiana, along with any other minutes of the meeting.

15. Approve the Engagement of Franklin Engineers and Consultants, LLC. to Provide Management Assistance for 2023 Landfill Gas Collection and Control System and to Provide Management Assistance for Construction Quality Assurance

The Sabine Parish Police Jury is required to install a Landfill Gas Collection and Control System at the solid waste landfill. The Parish has need of construction engineering services and construction quality assurance services.

16. Consider Appointment of New Sabine Parish Representative to the Northwest Louisiana Human Services District

James Tidwell resigned as Sabine Parish's representative on the board of the Northwest Louisiana Human Services District on September 10, 2023. The District has requested the Police Jury to identify and appoint a new Sabine Parish representative to the District Board.

Act 73 of the 2017 Louisiana regular session sets the required composition of the Board to include members with professional or personal knowledge in mental health, addictive disorders, developmental disabilities, finance, the judiciary, specialty courts, law enforcement, school-based healthcare, public health, or the coroner's office. The representative must also live and/or work in Sabine Parish.

President Sepulvado referred selection of a representative to the Personnel Committee.

17. Adopt a Resolution Requesting the Designation of Certain Census Tract Block Groups As Enterprise Zones for Participation in the Enterprise Zone Program Administered by the Louisiana Department of Economic Development

WHEREAS, LA R.S. 51:1784, pertaining to the Enterprise Zone Program, includes a provision that data from the most recent federal decennial census shall be applied in determining areas qualified for designation as enterprise zones; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development designates the below enumerated tracts as Enterprise Zone eligible based on the 2020 federal decennial census; and

WHEREAS, LA R.S. 51:1785, pertaining to the Enterprise Zone Program, includes a provision that the Louisiana Department of Economic Development shall only designate eligible block groups as Enterprise Zone if the local governing authority agrees to participate in the Enterprise Zone program;

18. Approve a Resolution Authorizing Execution of a Certificate of Sabine Parish Evidencing Public Approval of Bonds Pursuant to Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as Amended

The Sabine Parish Police Jury entered a cooperative endeavor agreement with the Capital Area Finance Authority to promote, encourage, and further the accomplishment of all activities which are or may have a public purpose, including, but not limited to the development of safe, sanitary single-family housing for the low and moderate income families on March 18, 2020.

The Capital Area Finance Authority is requesting the Sabine Parish Police Jury to approve the issuance of bonds approved by the Louisiana State Bond Commission on August 17, 2023. The Bonds are classified as exempt facility bonds, and the Internal Revenue Code requires that the issuance of the bonds be approved by the “applicable elected representative” of the governmental unit which issues the bonds or on whose behalf such bonds are issued and by the **“applicable elected representative’ of such other Participating Jurisdictions that have executed a cooperative endeavor agreement with the Authority under the provisions of the Act.**

23. Committee Reports

Mr. Mike McCormic, Chairman of the Broadband Committee, reported that he had spoken to Jason Hunt with Swift Connect and asked him to provide the Police Jury with the matching requirement. Mr. Hunt indicated that the Jury would be responsible for a 5% (\$510,000) match on the GUMBO Grants received.

24. Financial Report

Secretary Treasurer, William E. Weatherford, reported that as of September 30, 2023, the Parish had cash and cash equivalents totaling \$39,732,621.55. Of this amount, \$6,903,289.31 was restricted to road maintenance in the various road districts, \$505,435.29 in Parish Transportation Funds is restricted to road use, and \$1,285,131.81 of American Rescue Plan funds is committed to road use resulting in a total of \$8,693,856.41 available for repair and maintenance of roads.

\$1,000,000.00 of American Rescue Plan funding is committed for broadband service in the Parish.

\$6,000,000.00 is restricted by bond covenant to fund cell expansion at the landfill and \$479,743.63 is restricted for debt service. \$7,500,000.00 is available for landfill post closure costs and \$6,560,552.53 is available for other landfill needs including construction of a landfill gas collection system and land acquisition for expansion.

\$2,181,338.38 is restricted to use by the Health Unit and \$92,529.12 is restricted to the Industrial District. The General Fund has \$7,020,462.28 of cash available.

25. Operations

Road Superintendent Bobby Hughes reported that the Toro Creek Bridge has been demolished and the area cleaned. Construction for Barron Road Bridge should start in mid-November.

Mr. Hughes stated that he needed a truck driver. He asked if the Jury would consider hiring a temporary, part-time truck driver. The consensus of the Jury was to hire a temporary, part-time truck driver.
